Also in attendance were Deaconess Joyce Akinola, immediate past chairman of CHM Nigeria and current vice president, CHM Africa, Pastor Ian Meldrum who was present at the inauguration of CHM UK 25 glorious years ago, Pastor Abraham Sackey, senior pastor, All Nations Centre, Kennington, London who was the first minister at our inaugural conference 25 years ago, Pastor Bayo Olufemi, Pastor David Ogbonna, Pastor Joshua Boateng, Pastor George Udoh, Pastor Junior Giokabari, Pastor Richard Opedare and Pastor Jumoke Opedare, Elder Frank Orhurhu.

The conference coordinator was none other than the inimitable Pastor Edwin Bajomo who kept the proceedings lively and the audience entertained with his humour.

The conference was unique in that we had the pleasure of the presence of past health speakers which made it rather special. The conference health topic was "Building mental resilience: supporting ourselves and our children through life's challenges and it was presented by Dr Taiwo Ajayi, a consultant psychiatrist in Canterbury, Kent. The past speakers present included Mr Adeyemi Ogunremi, consultant obstetrician and gynaecologist, Mr Ayo Oshowo, consultant colorectal surgeon, Professor Roxanne Crosby-Nwaobi, Institute of Ophthalmology, University College, London (supported by the eye team), Dr Folake Durowoju, consultant community paediatrician, Dr Olumuyiwa OjoAromokudu, GP and Mrs Helen Fawehinmi, food technologist. Other doctors included Dr Chi Chi Ekhator, GP and director of Ascension Trust and Beacon Project, Lambeth, Dr Charlotte, GP, Dr Omolola Ojo-Aromokudu, GP and Dr Deji Durowoju, GP. We also had the pleasure of the presence of Rosaline Agyekum, a nurse specialist from King's College Hospital, London who was supported by the kidney team from that hospital.

Again as we mentioned at the conference, we reiterate here that, it is nothing short of a miracle in itself that this compassionate ministry has not once in its 25 years of existence received any government fund for its vast operation save for voluntary donations by well meaning citizens of this great nation. We are very grateful for their ongoing financial and spiritual support and pray that The Almighty God who is no man's debtor will repay them abundantly. Most extraordinary though, is the fact that all the activities of CHM worldwide are carried out by our steadfast volunteers to whom we continually owe a debt of gratitude.

So in looking forward to the next 25 years, if The Lord tarries, we wait patiently in anticipation of where next He will lead us. And speaking in the same vein, requests have been received for our services in two West African states namely Liberia and Guinea. Even prior to this, were requests from Jamaica and St Lucia in the Caribbean.

We are in the process of carrying out preliminary ground work coupled with prayerful consideration before these potential fields can be mandated to operate under the CHM banner. In other words, we go when and where The Lord leads. If The Lord leads us to establish CHM in Guinea, that will be our first move into a francophone (FrenchSpeaking) nation anywhere in the world.

As CHM volunteers, we believe this, 'If you have a happy home, a good education, health, friends, job, food, clothes, holidays; if you have access to the Bible, freedom to meet together and pray, and so on, then you are one of those to whom much has been given and from whom much will be expected.' 




