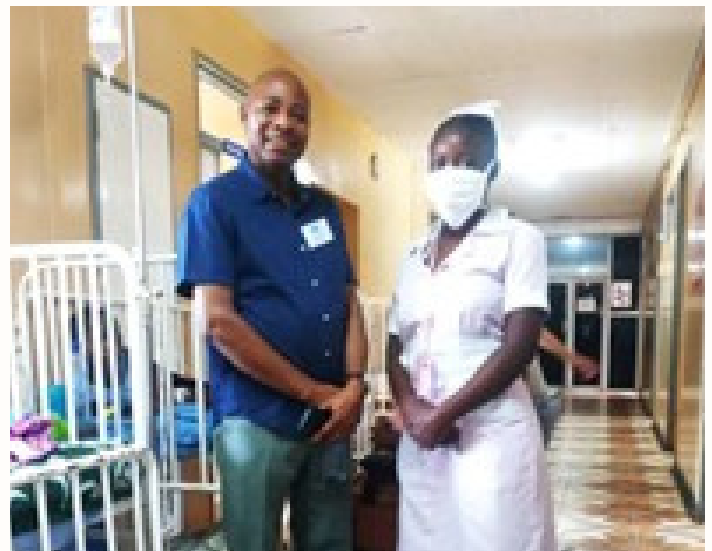

CHM Zambia

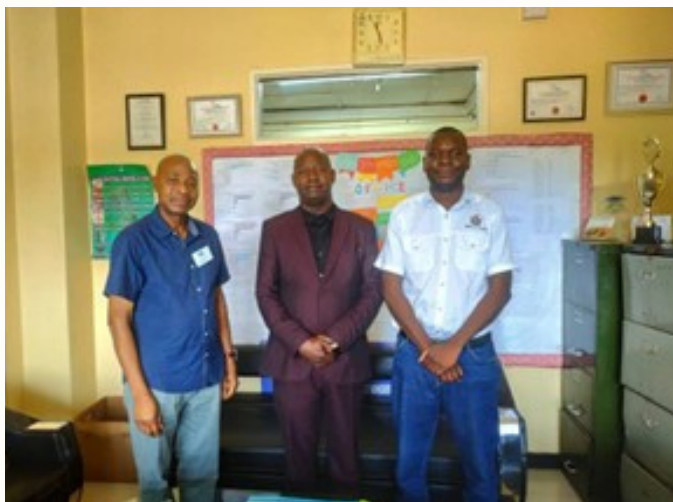

The South African annual conference and health awareness day took place on the 9th of November 2025 at the Full Gospel Church of God, Johannesburg. There was a large turnout at the conference with Revd Sam Ajibola, our inimitable president also in attendance. Those eagle-eyed readers among us may have noticed he was also present at the Zambian conference reported above just a day before; talk about mounting up with wings like the eagle and running without fainting. Thanks be to God for renewing his strength. Christ Hospital Ministry, in collaboration with the Full Gospel Church, Hillbrow Community Health Centre, Doctor Darko and the Sheriff's Office south of Johannesburg conducted a health awareness campaign at the Yellow Mountain settlement. The residents benefited from a variety of free health checks including vital signs checks, HIV/AIDS testing, prostate and cervical cancer screening. Also provided were health promotion, family planning advice and immunisations.

The chairman of our South African chapter, Pastor Jack Chirwa was also on Good health starts with good nutrition - Mealtime at the Zambian conference hand to direct the activities of the day supported by his army of volunteers. It was a very successful day with many in the community very satisfied with the help they received from CHM South Africa. Yellow Mountain is home to nearly 200 families, and over the last five years, the Full Gospel Church of God and the Sheriff's office have regularly visited the settlement to evangelise and distribute food. The initiative reflects ongoing efforts by Christ Hospital Ministry and its partners to provide support to enhance the health and welfare of less privileged communities in Johannesburg South.

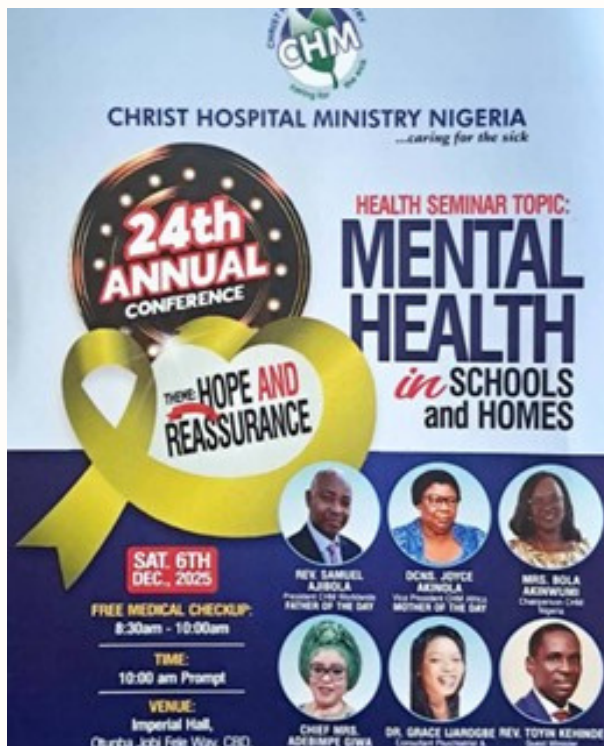
The 24th annual conference of CHM Nigeria was held on the 6th of December 2025 in Imperial hall, Ikeja, Lagos State. The theme of this year's conference was "hope and reassurance" and a medical seminar was held on mental health in schools and homes. In attendance at the conference were Chief (Mrs) Adebimpe Giwa, chairperson of the conference, Revd Sam Ajibola, president of CHM International, Deaconess Joyce Akinola, vice president CHM Africa, Mrs Bola Akinwumi, chairperson CHM Nigeria and chief host, special guests of honour, Dr (Mrs) Yemisi Olorunshola and Engr (Mrs) Omikunle as well as guest minister, Revd Toyin Kehinde. The conference was really well attended by guests from various walks of life including medical professionals and indeed local secondary school students.

Speaking at the event, President of CHM Worldwide, Rev. Samuel Ajibola, underscored the importance of the health seminar stating that the rise in the consumption of hard drugs especially among the youths was alarming and stressed the need for urgent intervention to curb the situation."

Revd Ajibola urged the youth to be vigilant and ignore any peer pressure to get involved in the consumption of illicit drugs stressing the danger of such behaviour and the irreversible damage to health attending such action. In her own speech, Vice President, CHM Africa, Deaconess Joyce Akinola, regretted the rise in mental illness which is sadly, now, a global health issue. She identified the poor economy in the country as one of a number of factors contributing to the rise in mental illness linking the high use of drugs among the youth to their attempt to escape the realities of life. Deaconess Akinola reiterated the ministry's plan to create awareness through public health campaigns to educate the community on the dangers posed by illicit drugs to health.

On her part, consultant psychiatrist & community advocate, Dr Grace Ijarogbe emphasised the urgency of addressing mental health issues stating that the response to the crisis is slow. She urged policy makers to integrate subjects on mental health in schools in order to educate the young ones on the dangers illicit substances pose to mental health.

CHM UK and Nigeria would like to seize this opportunity to congratulate Professor Yewande Oshodi, consultant psychiatrist at Lagos University Teaching Hospital (LUTH) on her recent professorial appointment in that discipline. Professor Yewande Oshodi was a past health seminar speaker at CHM Nigeria and UK conferences and our prayer is that her appointment will be a blessing and that she will increase in knowledge, wisdom and understanding in her chosen discipline.

CHM India

Conference:

The recently concluded 19th annual conference of Christ hospital ministry India was held between the 27th and 28th February 2026 in Nellore, India. The theme of the conference was "For the story and message of the cross is sheer absurdity and folly to those who are perishing and on their way to perdition but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." The entire program went on smoothly with powerful worship, inspiring message and meaningful participation from local pastors, leaders and believers alike.

In an atmosphere of congeniality not unfamiliar with our volunteers in India, free meals were provided for all who attended the conference shared with joy and unbridled fellowship all to the glory and honour of our Lord.

Medical Camp:

The medical camp took place on Saturday 28th February in Kalvamula Kandriga, Gangapatnam village, Nellore district covering 17 villages. The medical camp is an outreach provided to those with limited access to proper healthcare facilities. Financial donations were made to provide food for many of the villagers and transportation was provided for about 650 recipients who required referral for further treatment.

The medical camp enjoyed the services of some government hospital specialists who provided their expertise free of charge. These included Dr. Manjulamma, eye specialist, Dr. Gopi and Dr. Sarath Babu (assistants to Dr. Manjulamma). Others included Dr. Jayraj, kidney specialist and general physician as well as Dr. Thulasi Ram, orthopaedic surgeon. These specialists were assisted by other junior doctors, government nurses, volunteers and church members from ACA church. Part of the services provided on the day included health checks, free eye treatment and provision of free glasses.

Matthew 25:35-40: *"for I was hungry and you gave Me food; I was thirsty and you gave Me drink; I was a stranger and you took Me in; I was naked and you clothed Me; I was sick and you visited Me; I was in prison and you came to Me." "Then the righteous will answer Him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You, or thirsty and give You drink? When did we see You a stranger and take You in, or naked and clothe You? Or when did we see You sick, or in prison, and come to You?'
